### INTER-HOUSE COMPETITION

The Blue Memorial Shields were presented to the School by Mrs. Blue in memory of her husband, Mr. James Blue, who was principal teacher of English from 1931 to 1941. The names of the winning Houses, Boys and Girls, and the names of the respective Captains are inscribed annually on the Shields.

Each pupil, on entering the Secondary Department, is allocated to a House and remains a member of that House throughout his or her School career. It is evident that the Houses will not remain of the same numerical strength, but this disadvantage is neutralised by the method of scoring in the competition. Two main principles are followed in this scoring method: work and games have exactly the same bearing on the result and the performance of every pupil in some cases and of as many as possible in all other cases affects the ultimate decision. For the result in School work, the average place per class is the dominating factor and the merit places of first, second and third is a secondary factor.

Rugby and Hockey, followed by Cricket and Girls' Tennis, are given most weight in the Games section, but Athletics, Swimming, Golf and Boys' Tennis are included. School awards of caps and colours, regular places in 1st and 2nd Teams, House Matches, Championships, Certificates of Attainment (e.g. swimming certificates) are all considered in deciding the best

House in any session.

### SCHOOL RULES

GENERAL: The purpose of these rules is to help in the smooth running of the School; and pupils at all times should realise that their behaviour reflects on the good name of the School. Outside School, pupils should always recognise courteously members of Staff; for instance, boys by saluting.

### I. The following are forbidden:

- Football and other ball games, not under supervision, in the Cloisters and Quadrangle.
- 2. The throwing of stones or snowballs anywhere within the precincts of the School.
- Running, or causing obstruction, within the Cloisters or Quadrangle.
- The leaving of litter in any form anywhere within the School. Desks must not be used as receptacles for litter.
- The defacing of School property, and the alteration of authorised notices.
- The leaving of books, sports gear, clothing, etc., anywhere within the School outwith School hours.
- The shifting of desks and tampering with light switches, doors or windows.
- Cycling anywhere within the School grounds, front and back. Cycles must not be wheeled on the concrete paths to the inconvenience of pedestrians.
- The attaching of the School name, or of any class thereof, to any party or function organised or held in or out of School, without the authority of the Rector.

### II. No pupil is permitted, without the authority of the Rector :

- To leave School during School hours.
- 2. To be in any room before 9 a.m. or during intervals.

- To loiter in School after 4 p.m., or to enter any room at the beginning of a period before the arrival of the teacher.
- 4. To enter or leave except by the gates, back and front. Climbing walls, fences and gates is strictly forbidden.
- To enter or leave except by the appropriate entrance, boys' or girls'.

### III.

- All garments likely to be discarded during School hours must be clearly marked with the name of the owner.
- No valuables may be left in cloakrooms or anywhere else within the School precincts.
- All books must bear the name of the owner in ink. Textbooks must also bear the dates of the session in which the book is in the keeping of the pupil. The School cannot accept responsibility for lost property.

### IV. Members of Staff have authority to :

- Supervise behaviour of pupils on the way to and from School, e.g. to prohibit smoking, wilful damage, trespassing on private ground and misbehaving in buses.
- Exercise control over all School activities, including parties (finance, programmes, general behaviour, etc.) and publications.
